The EUMM's priorities are to ensure that there is no return to hostilities, to facilitate the resumption of a safe and normal life for the affected local population and to build confidence amongst the conflict parties.

Day and night, EUMM patrols observe, analyse and gather information on the ground. Subjects covered include specific incidents, the freedom of movement for those living in the adjacent areas, detentions, the remnants of war, unexploded ordnance, borderization, disruption of the supply of basic facilities, and access to lands, buildings or religious sites. The work is carried out in an impartial and transparent way.

Particular incidents, issues or concerns are raised on the "hotline" between the Mission and the sides or at the regular Incident Prevention and Response Mechanism meetings, co-facilitated by the OSCE and EUMM in one theatre and chaired by the UN in the other. The aim is to defuse as quickly as possible any situation that may possibly lead to an escalation in tension. The IPRMs have proven useful, leading to the exchange of information about specific incidents or events, the simultaneous release of certain detainees, co-operation in ensuring the safety of agricultural works and early notification of particular activities such as military training.
